

Please help prevent accidental 911 calls.

The E.T.S.B has received a significant number of accidental 911 calls from our area recently. Most

of them are children calling without realizing it. Every single 911 call that comes into 911 is answered and attended to. Accidental 911 calls cost a significant amount of money and resources every year. They also tie up emergency services and phone lines.

Many cell phones, including iPhones and Android devices, have an Emergency SOS feature that automatically dials 911.

How to prevent accidental 9-1-1 calls:

- Review the settings on your mobile phone to choose your emergency alert settings and to lock it appropriately, based on your needs. (Note: review these periodically as your device settings may reset after a manufacturer's update). To update your emergency settings:
 - o iPhone: click on "Settings" and "Emergency SOS"
 - o Android: click on "Settings" and "Safety and emergency"
- Store your phone properly so it is not bouncing around in your purse or in your pocket to be sat on. If the side button is pressed five times, it could initiate a 9-1-1 call.
- Do not let children play with active or old phones. Even if your old phone is unregistered with no SIM card or cellphone plan, it can still call 9-1-1.

What to do if you call 911 by mistake:

 Stay on the line. When you call 911, the call is tracked in the queue, even if you hang up. Please stay on the line to inform the operator that you are safe.

PROPERTY MAINTENACE & NUISANCE ORDINANCES



BUILDING MAINTENANCE: All buildings must have a structurally sound foundation and supporting walls and provide the amenities essential for human habitation. Dilapidated, decayed, & unsanitary shall be considered dangerous and a nuisance.

MAINTENANCE OF PREMISES: Each an every premises shall be kept free of all nuisances, health, safety, and fire hazards, unsanitary conditions, and infestations. It is the duty of the property owner to keep the premises free of said conditions and to promptly remove and abate the same.

WEEDS OR HIGH GRASS: Cannot grow to a heigh greater than 8 inches, or any accumulation of dead weeds or grass cannot be exposed to public view.



TRASH, JUNK, DEBRIS: Such items are prohibited from being left on your property for extended periods of time. They must be properly disposed of.

VEHICLES: Must have current & updated registration and tags. Must be equipped with all parts required to legally operate safely on the roadway.

JUNK &/OR INOPERABLEVEHICLES: Must be stored within a building or other location not exposed to public view, or shall be removed from the premises.

The exterior of every premises and structure shall be maintained in good repair, to the end that the premises and each structure thereon will be preserved; adjoining properties protected from blighting influences; and safety and fire hazards eliminated.
