*Project 6899-water improvements/tower/IEPA loan-*waiting period for comments are up in approximately 10 days. Once done, official application can be made to IEPA. Bidding will occur May / June.

2019 MFT-\$725,000 to do all the streets; till-reshape and compact all streets and apply A2 oil and chip surface. Poll of the trustees: Netterville; do all of roads; Ferriell, do all of roads, use \$100,000 MFT funds and \$80,000 general fund; Nave agrees with Ferriell; Endrizzi, do all of roads but prefers not to touch MFT funds; Estep, do all of roads but borrow the \$72,000. Motion by Trustee Estep to have Engineer Mary Cave to prepare a proposal using the left hand column (on her handout)-10 year loan, use \$72,000 MFT fund (instead of \$180.000), approximate cost and start paperwork for the grant. Netterville 2nd. Roll call: Nave, yes; Netterville, yes; Estep, yes; Ferriell, yes; Endrizzi, yes. Approved 5-0.
